30/06/2017 – Enter with Intent – Stapylton Road, Forestdale – Between 17:30 30/06/2017 and 06:20 01/07/2017 – Access gained by cutting mesh wire fence to access storage shed at the business address. Items stolen include timber, landscaping supplies, and assorted power tools.

There has been a rise in stealing from motor vehicle offences in recent weeks, especially trade vehicles which contain power tools. This may be an opportunity to remind residents to be extra cautious when leaving vehicles unattended throughout the day and night.

Applications for the *We Are Queensland* Small Grants Program close on Friday, 11 August.

This grants program comes as part of the Palaszczuk Government's \$7.4 million investment over the next four years to implement a state-wide action plan to strengthen communities, counter anti-social behaviour and promote benefits of our state's diversity.

I strongly encourage eligible community groups to apply for grants between \$5,000 and \$20,000 to assist in undertaking community-led initiatives.

Last week we saw grants from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund awarded to St George Willawong Football Club and St John's Anglican College Parents and Friends Association, but Forestdale community groups also have a lot to offer.

Our community organisations like the Forestdale Neighbourhood Watch are amazing at bringing people together, but often lack funds for larger scale events. I strongly encourage eligible groups such as our local not-for-profits, parents and friend's associations, and our sports clubs to apply for the grants program.

There are many people in our community who generously volunteer their time to groups like the Forestdale Neighbourhood Watch, but they are one of many who work tirelessly to make an impact.

I know that there are many groups in our community like this who need support to continue doing their amazing work.
