This year, Queensland will celebrate its 158th birthday, on Tuesday 6 June.

Queensland Day is a chance to celebrate the state's culture, heritage, people, places and industry. A time for all Queenslanders to stand tall and be proud of our accomplishments.

Officially, Queensland Day marks the state's separation from New South Wales as an independent colony on 6 June 1859. Here's a little more on the history behind this special milestone:

Moves towards statehood began with a public meeting in 1851 to consider separation from New South Wales. As the push for separation gained momentum, Queen Victoria was approached to consider establishing a separate colony based in Moreton Bay.

The Queen gave her approval and signed the Letters Patent on 6 June 1859, now known as Queensland Day. Not surprisingly, she favoured the name Queensland over suggestions to call it Cooksland in honour of Captain James Cook.

As part of this year's celebration I want to acknowledge the hard work, passion and commitment of local people that make a difference across the Algester Electorate.

I am putting a call out to local residents to nominate an exceptional individual or group who you feel deserves to be recognised for their contribution to the community. If you know someone who lives in the Algester Electorate – or who is associated with a community group, business or school in the electorate – who you think is inspiring and makes you proud to be a Queenslander - please nominate them for a Queensland Day award.

I am happy to report that "No B Double" signage will soon be erected along the Logan City side of Johnson Road. Residents need to be aware that Johnson Road is the Logan City and Brisbane City boundary. As such Brisbane City Council control the Brisbane side of Johnson Road.

I have approached Minister Leeanne Enoch to take up the introduction of a "No Exhaust Braking" law in Queensland. I have suggested to Minister Enoch that the laws should apply between the hours of 6.00pm and 5.00am.

Forestdale was lucky in that there was only minimal damage resulting from the ex-cyclone Debbie low. We should be conscious of effects on people's properties and transport infrastructure. There are some twenty



reconnaissance teams across the city repairing broken bridges, roads, footpaths and flooded buildings. A sobering example is the Stanmore Crossing

which will be out for approximately 12-18 months due to house colliding with it during the flooding.

With the National Broadband Network being installed in

Forestdale, resident should be aware of the 18 month period to connect from when notice is received that NBN connectivity is available.

Federal budget 2017: Billions set to be injected into Melbourne to Brisbane inland rail project



The nation building inland rail project and its potential impact on Forestdale was a topic of discussion during last Mondays NHW Meeting.

Residents at the meeting agreed that the nation building project would

certainly go ahead in the coming years. The project will include upgrades to the existing rail line and corridor that borders Forestdale. Local resident Stan Corbett presented information to the community meeting sourced from documents provided by Parsons Brinckerhoff for the ARTC.

- Train length 1800m with provision for 3600m length trains
- Axle loads and speeds, 21Tonnes @ 115km/h, 25Tonnes@ 80km/h with provision for 30Tonnes@ 80km/h
- Double stacking of containers requires 7.1m clearance
- Interoperability with standard gauge and dual gauging in Queensland
- Corridor width 40m
- Kagaru to Acacia Ridge uses approx. 35km of existing track. Will be upgraded for height clearance and double stacking whilst remaining a single track. Dual line not in scope
- The line from Acacia Ridge to the Brisbane Port is not in the scope of work
- The ten-year design and construction schedule is being pushed hard with possible 'fast tracking' on receipt of further funding (Tuesday's Federal Budget).

For our section of the line from Kagaru to Acacia Ridge the eventual traffic buildup will be:

- Average trains per week 362
- Peak trains per week 424
- Included in above figures are 168 coal trains per week
- Average 52 trains per day through Forestdale/Hillcrest

As a community, we need to ensure that that sufficient environmental structures to address the three aspects of noise, dust and vibration are included in the design.
